Recommendations for knitting density

To ensure your knitting matches the gauge used in the pattern, knit a small swatch. It's best to do this before starting the actual project. After knitting a small swatch, count the number of stitches and rows within 10 cm of fabric. If you have more stitches than stated in the pattern, your knitting may be tighter; if fewer, your knitting may be looser.

Needles: 12 mm. 10 cm = 8 stitches. 10 cm = 10 rows.

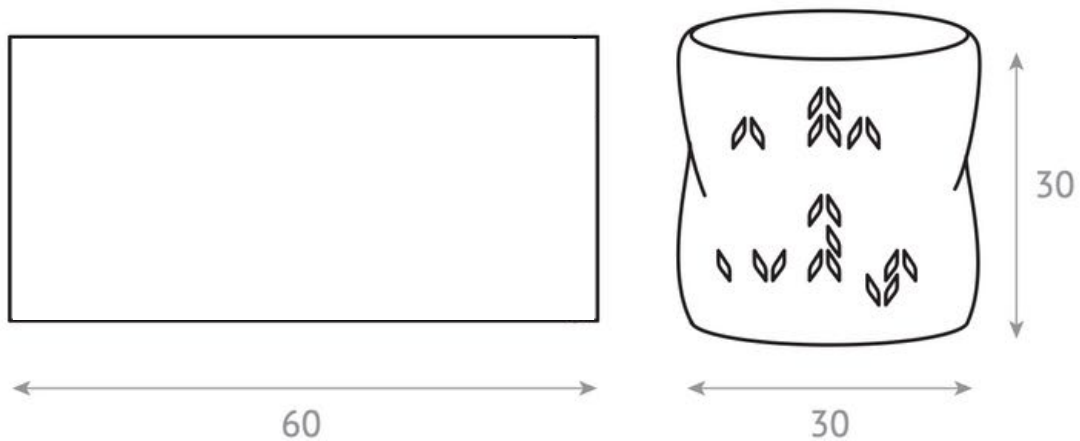
This video tutorial will teach you how to bind off stitches and finish your knitting project neatly. Learn the step-by-step process to secure your stitches and give your piece a clean edge.

Let's get started!

- Cast on 43 stitches (odd number).
- Join in the round and knit 1 knit, 1 purl.
- Round 1: work all stitches through the front loop.
- From Round 2 onward: above each knit stitch → purl through the front loop; above each purl stitch → knit through the back loop.
- Continue until almost all the yarn is used.
- Bind off all stitches in knit.
- Sew the beginning and end of the round together with a needle and hide the yarn tails.

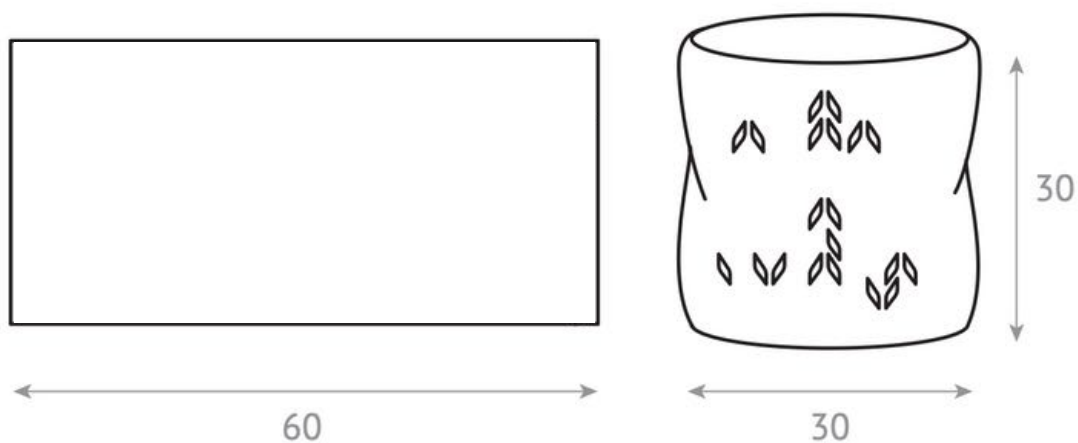


Los geht's!

- Schlage 43 Maschen an (ungerade Zahl).
- Stricke in Runden: 1 Masche rechts, 1 Masche links.
- Runde 1: alle Maschen durch das vordere Maschenglied stricken.
- Ab Runde 2: über jeder rechten Masche → links durch das vordere Maschenglied stricken; über jeder linken Masche → rechts durch das hintere Maschenglied stricken.
- Weiterstricken, bis fast das ganze Garn aufgebraucht ist.
- Alle Maschen rechts abketten.
- Den Anfang und das Ende der Runde mit einer Nähnadel zusammennähen und die Fadenenden vernähen.

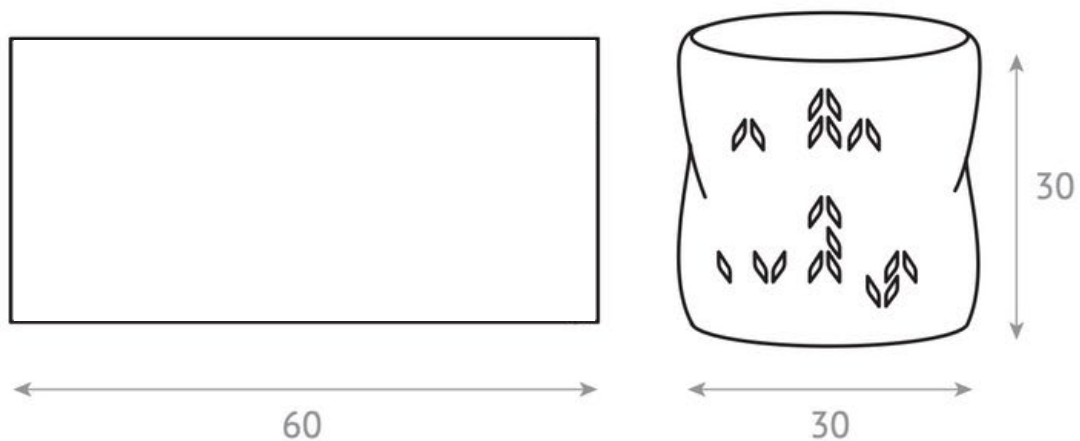


C'est parti !

- Montez 43 mailles (nombre impair).
- Tricotez en rond : 1 maille endroit, 1 maille envers.
- Tour 1 : tricotez toutes les mailles par le brin avant.
- À partir du tour 2 : sur chaque maille endroit → tricoter à l'envers par le brin avant ; sur chaque maille envers → tricoter à l'endroit par le brin arrière.
- Continuez jusqu'à ce que presque tout le fil soit utilisé.
- Rabattez toutes les mailles à l'endroit.
- Cousez le début et la fin du tour avec une aiguille et rentrez les fils.

¡Empecemos!

- Montar 43 puntos (número impar).
- Tejer en redondo: 1 punto derecho, 1 punto revés.
- Vuelta 1: tejer todos los puntos por la hebra delantera.
- Desde la vuelta 2: sobre cada punto derecho → tejer del revés por la hebra delantera; sobre cada punto revés → tejer del derecho por la hebra trasera.
- Continuar hasta gastar casi todo el hilo.
- Cerrar todos los puntos del derecho.
- Coser el inicio y el final de la vuelta con una aguja y esconder las hebras.
